As of September 1, 2011, all National Athletic Equipment Reconditioners Association (NAERA) members will not recertify nor recondition any football helmet 10 years of age or older. (See the *SIAW Risk Alert* dated April 2011 found under the downloads section at www.siaw.us)



This ruling standardizes the useful life of all football helmets. Due to this standardization, please be advised of the following:

- Schools should review shipments of all new football helmets for the 2011 season.
 - Schools should accept only new helmets, not helmets manufactured in previous years.
 - Each new helmet should be checked and schools should accept only helmets manufactured in 2011 to assure the potential for a maximum 10-year useful life.
 - If schools decide to accept older helmets that have never been used, the school may not see the full 10-year useful life cycle for the helmet.
- Note: helmets may be rejected during the 10-year life span, due to damage.*

Our goal in this matter is to help schools make certain they are getting the most value from the funds spent on purchasing football helmets.
